

Official Primary Ballot

Nonpartisan Office and Special Primary for Partisan Office

February 18, 2020

Notice to voters: If you are voting on Election Day, your ballot must be initialed by 2 election inspectors. If you are voting absentee, your ballot must be initialed by the municipal clerk or deputy clerk. Your ballot may not be counted without initials. (See end of ballot for initials.)

IMPORTANT! It is recommended to use an official ballot marking pen available at your polling place or a #2 pencil.

General Instructions

If you make a mistake on your ballot or have a question, ask an election inspector for help. (Absentee voters: Contact your municipal clerk.)

To vote for a name on the ballot, complete the arrow next to the name like this: ←

To vote for a name that is not on the ballot, write the name on the line marked "write-in," and complete the arrow next to the name like this: ←

Special Instructions for Voting in a Partisan Primary

In a Partisan Primary:

- You may vote in only ONE party's primary.
- If you choose a party, votes cast in that party will be counted. Votes cast in any other party will not be counted.
- If you do not choose a party, and you vote in more than one party, no votes will be counted.

You must vote for one individual candidate.
